
In any condition, 95% of all textiles can be recycled or reused Reduce - Reuse - Recycle

recycled each year, there is a long, long way to go!






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

• EAC proposed ban on import of used clothing

East African Community Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, Burundi, and Rwanda.

Very large market with significant implications if ban takes place.

Combined population: 153 million people.

Current value of used clothing imports: 300 million.

Employment: 10's of thousands.

Entrepreneurship: 1000's of micro entrepreneurs.
